

1.2. DEMOGRAPHICS



Valencia has a current population of 782,846, and has a metropolitan area with a population of over one and a half million. With 18% of the total population of the Region, Valencia ranks as the third largest city in Spain.



1.3. POLITICAL SYSTEM

As established by the Spanish Constitution of 1978, Spain is a social democratic state in law that has adopted the parliamentary monarchy as its political system. Legislative power resides in the General Parliament, made up of the Congress and the Senate. In territorial terms, Spain is organised into municipalities, 51 provinces, 17 autonomous communities or regions, and 2 autonomous cities.

The autonomous Region of Valencia comprises three provinces: Castellón, Alicante and Valencia. The regional capital is Valencia. The regional instrument of government is the "Generalitat", comprising a legislative body or parliament (Corts Valencianes), and executive branch (el Consell) and a judicial body, a higher court of justice (Tribunal Superior de Justicia de la Comunidad Valenciana).

1.4. CLIMATE

Valencia has an excellent climate: the city enjoys over 300 days of sunshine every year, due to which it is often called the city of light and colour. In the summer the average temperature is around 21°C and winters offer mild temperatures of 13°C. Located on the coast, humidity is usually high, and in autumn and spring there are often heavy rains.

1.5. HISTORY

Founded in the year 138 BC, the city of Valencia has a layout and architectural heritage comprising remains of Roman, Visigoth and Moorish civilisations, which all left their imprint on this city. The Moorish influence is the strongest due to its intensity and span over the centuries. The Arab legacy is still visible today in some of the region's characteristic features - the irrigation system, the growing of rice and the market gardens and orange orchards.

Valencia was taken from the Moors by James I in 1238, initiating its Christian period, in which Valencia became part of a Kingdom under the crown of Aragon. The city obtained its statutory rights and experienced a transformation into a Christianised city, with the construction of the cathedral of Valencia and the appearance of Gothic architecture.

The 15th century was Valencia's Golden Age. The city experienced unprecedented cultural, economic and political growth, becoming one of the strongest powers on the Mediterranean. Dating from this time are the emblematic buildings of the "Lonja" or Silk Exchange, the Miguelete cathedral tower and the city gates Torres de Serranos.

Following the War of Spanish Succession and the arrival of the Bourbons to the Spanish throne, Valencia was stripped of its traditional regional rights. After another flourishing epoch in the 18th century, during which Valencia developed its textile industry, the 19th century brought incipient industrialisation and economic growth in exports and finances. The demolition of the city walls in 1865 symbolised the start of an age of expansion and the rise of the bourgeoisie, reflected in the development of the city in the area known as the Ensanche, or extension.

In the early 20th century, the city underwent significant urban and architectural development due to the Regional Exhibition of 1909 and the development of modernism in middle-class areas. Some examples of this period are the buildings along Calle de la Paz and the main railway station Estación del Norte.


Following the Spanish Civil War, Valencia, which had initiated a new cycle of urban development, started on the road to recovery. However, it suffered an important setback due to flooding in 1957. After this Valencia began to experience a new phase of transformation, with the so-called "South Plan" of the 1970s taking the Turia river to the south of the city and opening up new possibilities for development.

In the 1980s and 90s the city once again started on the road to urban transformation.



with the start-up of projects such as the City of the Arts and Sciences, the Valencia Conference Centre, the music auditorium Palau de la Música and the Modern Art Institute IVAM.

The staging of the 32nd America's Cup event in 2007 will undoubtedly spark off renewed urban development for the whole city of Valencia, thanks to which an old dream will come true - the recovery of the inner harbour of the port for the use and enjoyment of all citizens.





4.1 THE SPANISH EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM

The Spanish educational system comprises Pre-school Education, School Education and University Education. Education in Spain is mandatory and free of charge for all children between the ages of 6 and 16. The following table lists all educational levels:





10.2. PORT

The Port of Valencia is a major trading port in Spain and one of the busiest in the Mediterranean basin.

Passengers and recreational craft traffic has acquired much greater importance in the last few years, and shipping companies are increasingly opting for stopovers in the city.

Today, the city welcomes over 50 cruisers and over 40,000 cruiser tourists each year.

Festival, Sea Cloud Cruises, Arcalia Shipping, Mediterranean Shipping Cruises and Swan Helene are some of the cruiser companies that make stopovers in Valencia.

Currently, there are passenger routes between Valencia and the following European cities: Ibiza, Palma, Mahon Livorno-Florence, Palermo, Salerno-Naples, Malta and Tunis (La Goulette).

10.6. TAXIS

Taxis in the city of Valencia are all coloured white, with the word "taxi" on top and a licence number stamped on the side. They also carry an ID plaque with the licence number inside. When a taxi is free, it normally shows a white flipdown sign with red letters saying "LIBRE" inside the front windscreen, and it will always have a

green light on the roof of the vehicle. If no green light is showing, the taxi is occupied.

Valencia and its metropolitan area are divided into two tariff zones: Area A, including the municipal area of Valencia, and Area B including the metropolitan area.

In addition there are two different rates depending on the time:

Prices are established each year and should be clearly visible inside the vehicle. There is a flat rate for starting out, an authorised supplement for trips to the airport, and a minimum rate per service. It is not permitted to charge a supplement for transporting suitcases or other objects in taxis. The driver is obliged to provide change up to a limit of a 20-euro banknote. The user has the right to ask for a receipt for the service provided.

Taxis can be taken at any point in the city by hailing one down using your arm, or at established taxi ranks, or over the phone using the services provided by taxi companies. This chart shows the taxi companies operating in the city of Valencia:

10.7. BIKE LANE

Due to its flat geography and its pleasant climate, Valencia is the ideal city to cycle around in. The city has an extensive network of bike lanes called "carril bici", which are being increased on a daily basis as the city expands.

Cycling regulations

On city streets it is not compulsory for cyclists to use protective headgear, but it is obligatory on interurban roads. Children up to seven years of age may be transported on a bicycle as long as it is equipped with an approved children's seat. For the information of cyclist drinkers, the general alcohol in blood levels for drivers of motor vehicles (0.5) may also be applied to cyclists.
